### St Simon and St Jude

Two of the Twelve Apostles

Feast day: 28th October  
Simon evangelised in Egypt and Jude in Mesopotamia and then together in Persia where they were martyred.

Jude has a short Epistle in the New Testament ascribed to him. He writes:



*"They are like waterless clouds blown about by the winds, or like autumn trees, barren and uprooted as being twice dead, like wild sea waves foaming with their own shame, or like wandering stars for which the gloom of darkness is stored up for ever."*
